Completed example of the Consequence vs. Likelihood Chart

The decision is whether or not I am going to lie to my parents about going to a party.

- (M) Material consequences
- (E) Emotional consequences
- (R) Relational consequences

<p>* (E) I'll have peace of mind while at the party</p>	<p>* (R) Friends will keep inviting me to parties</p> <p>* (E) Feel included</p> <p>* (R) Have fun with friends</p>
UNLIKELIHOOD	LIKELIHOOD
	<p>* (E) If they find out, I'll feel angry & resentful</p> <p>* (E) If they don't find out, I'll feel guilty and nervous</p> <p>* (R) If they find out, parents stop trusting me</p> <p>* (M) If they find out, parents might impose consequences like no TV or phone</p>
