

Condom Statement Sets

Each statement set has 2 true statements and 1 false statement. Circle the statement in each set that is false.

STATEMENT SET 1

- a) Condoms make sex less pleasurable.
- b) Condoms (external and internal) and abstinence are the only forms of contraception that provide dual protection from pregnancy and STBBIs.
- c) The most commonly used contraceptive methods among youth are condoms, withdrawal method, and the oral contraceptive pill.

STATEMENT SET 2

- a) Condoms are available without a prescription.
- b) Condoms last forever.
- c) The withdrawal method requires constant communication between partners during sex.

STATEMENT SET 3

- a) Communication is important before, during, and after any kind of sexual activity.
- b) If you remove a condom part way through without communicating, the sex becomes non-consensual.
- c) If the condom goes on the penis after penetration (but before ejaculation) there is no risk of pregnancy and STBBIs.

STATEMENT SET 4

- a) If a condom breaks during penis-vagina intercourse, there is no reason to be concerned about pregnancy.
- b) Ensuring that you have condoms on hand is the responsibility of all partners.
- c) When using lubricant “lube” with condoms, it needs to be water-based.

STATEMENT SET 5

- a) It is important to be well-lubricated before anything goes into the vagina or anus.
- b) Extra lube can increase pleasure and prevent the condom from breaking.
- c) Wearing two condoms is a good idea because it provides extra protection.

STATEMENT SET 6

- a) External condoms can be found at most drugstores, grocery stores, pharmacies, and convenience stores.
- b) If a pregnancy test comes out positive, there is a chance you aren't pregnant.
- c) It is important to pinch the tip of the condom as you place it on a penis.
